Preparedness of teachers and administrators as first responders to crises

Start Date: July 3, 2023

Overview: This research position will support a program of research. The program of research focuses on examining crisis leadership and management. The project addresses the increasing need to better understand the level of preparedness that teachers and administrators have in terms of planning, training, and taking leadership for crisis management in schools.

Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

The project involves conducting a literature review, developing data collection tools, and data collection through surveys and interviews to examine how prepared teachers and administrators are in responding to different crisis events; and the types of mental health supports are available post-crisis response.

The primary job duties for the research assistant (RA-2, GRA-1, or GRA-2) will include work such as conducting literature reviews, preparing grant applications and research ethics board applications, interviewing study participants and managing research data. There may be opportunities to be involved in data analysis and manuscript preparation.

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Venise Bryan at Athabasca University and Dr. Glory Ovie at the King's University Edmonton. The candidate will be provided with adequate training for all activities including literature searches, data management, analysis, and writing (grant preparation, manuscript preparation, ethics applications) that will be required. The successful candidate will gain valuable experience in many aspects of conducting research and co-authorship as applicable.

This is a casual position with flexibility in hours. Rate of pay commensurate with experience and collective agreement provisions. All duties can be completed remotely.

- Strong writing skills
- Ability to work remotely.
- Experience with manuscript preparation and literature reviews
- Completion of TCPS 2.0 CORE module an asset
- Previous research experience, quantitative research or mixed methods background preferred.
