

Research Assistant Opportunity Casual Position

Mental Health and Substance Use Health Workforce Policy

Start Date: As soon as possible

Overview: This research assistant position is an opportunity to work with our research team on a CIHR-funded research project examining mental health and substance use health workforce policy.

Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

- Conducting and supporting literature reviews, policy scans, policy dialogues, and knowledge mobilization activities such as manuscript preparation;
- Working with a large network of partner organizations;
- Participating in team meetings; and
- Supporting qualitative data analysis.

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Kathleen (Kate) Leslie at Athabasca University. Dr. Leslie will provide training and mentorship for all research activities.

This is a casual position with flexible hours. The rate of pay will be commensurate with experience and collective agreement provisions. All duties can be completed remotely.

Qualifications:

Requirements include:

- graduate training in nursing, law, public health, or public policy;
- a strong understanding of mental health, substance use health, regulation, and workforce policy;
- experience with qualitative research;
- strong ability to work independently and as part of a research team; and
- excellent research and writing skills

Preferred qualifications include:

- experience supporting research projects;
- experience with reference management software; and
- technological skills with Teams/Zoom to support virtual policy dialogues

All applicants are thanked for their interest in this position; however, only candidates selected for an interview will be contacted.
