Overview:

Dr. Gina Martin is looking to hire a part-time Graduate Research Assistant to support work investigating the impact of climate change on the mental well-being of adolescents. This position will contribute to this research area by working on ethics applications, focus group interviews, and manuscript writing. The successful applicant may also be involved in grant writing.

Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

The primary duties for research assistant will include:

- Conducting focus groups
- Transcribing focus groups discussions
- Producing qualitative and quantitative summary reports of findings
- Bi-weekly meetings with members of the research team

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Gina Martin at Athabasca University. Dr. Martin will provide training in focus group discussions and development of study protocols.

- Ability to work collaboratively
- Able to prioritize tasks and manage deadlines
- Previous research experience
- Interest in young people's health and well-being and/or planetary health
