Advanced Practice Nurse Job Satisfaction Study

Position start date: ASAP

Overview: This quantitative study will evaluate advanced practice nurse job satisfaction and intent to leave globally. The project will apply two standardized scales to evaluate advanced practice nurse job satisfaction and intent to leave their current position or the profession. Ethics has been approved and we are eager to move forward with the online sampling plan and survey dissemination. The successful RA applicant will be involved in planning, sampling, data analysis and report writing for the quantitative part of this study.

Specific activities include, but are not limited to:

1. Developing a comprehensive literature review of this topic and preparing it for publication
2. Setting up the approved survey in redcap
3. Working in collaboration with the team to develop a strategic data collection plan considering relevant organizations and opportunities among social media platforms
4. Monitor the survey process and document any procedural considerations that may be useful in post study reporting
5. Meet with PIs and team members as necessary
6. Write first draft of findings
7. Write draft abstracts for fall 2024/2025 conferences
8. Develop poster presentation(s) and PowerPoint presentation(s) as needed
9. Assist with funding applications to support this body of work going forward

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Jennifer-Lynn Fournier at Athabasca University. Dr. Fournier will provide adequate training required.

Qualifications:

1. Graduate learner with an academic interest in the Advanced Practice Nursing profession and quantitative research.
2. Familiarity with Advanced Practice Nursing theory, foundations and current trends.
3. Ability to take direction, work independently and interdependently
4. Ability to prioritize this project and associated timelines
5. Can work from home, as all activities will be in virtual environment, including Teams meetings.
