

Research Assistant Opportunity Contract Position

Website Designer: Trans Lab

Overview: The Trans Lab for Qualitative Research is an interdisciplinary research hub at Athabasca University that supports the production of affirming, intersectional, and critical qualitative research. We are currently seeking a website designer and social media specialist, who will be contracted to build comprehensive online resources for digital, community-based research knowledge mobilization. This includes the creation of an interactive and accessible website to provide information about the Trans Lab, to showcase arts-based research outcomes, and mobilize upcoming research findings for a diverse audience.

The primary job duties for this contract will include:

- Meeting with client and establishing requirements
- Visual design and concept mapping
- Working with the client to determine web hosting and platform solutions
- Source, select and organize additional information for inclusion in the website
- Design execution, including appearance, layout and flow
- Full development of the website (including planning, writing, modifying, integrating and testing website related code, final implementation, ensuring high-quality user experience)
- Progressing brand and web presence through pre-established social media platforms
- Web and social media consultation meetings with Principle Investigator

Deliverables include:

- Completed interactive website for the Trans Lab (visually appealing and functionally sound)
- Four 1-hour consultative meetings with the Primary Investigator
- Updates to Trans Lab social media (Facebook, Instagram, Linktree)

The successful candidate will work with, and directly report to, Dr. Tobias Wiggins at Athabasca University.

Qualifications:

- Design Expertise: A minimum of 4 years of experience in web design and social media, demonstrated by a portfolio showcasing strong design skills. Knowledge of accessibility in web design.
- Technical Expertise: Expertise in industry standard design software such as Adobe Illustrator, InDesign, and Photoshop, expertise in front-end languages such as CSS, HTML, Javascript, and JQuery.

- Collaborative Approach: A proven track record of effective teamwork, contributing to a positive and productive team environment.
- Effective Communication: Strong communication abilities, capable of clearly articulating design concepts and engaging constructively with feedback.
- Interest in social justice and/or transgender rights and scholarship

The position is based in Calgary Alberta but can be completely remotely. Compensation for this contract can be negotiated according to the applicant's rates and expertise.
